CREATIVE WRITING RADE ENTOMOLOGY (GRADING CONTRACT)

sounds scary...but really, it's not.

WHAT IS IT?

A grading contract is an agreement between a teacher and students on how grades will be earned in class. In this course, we're using a format introduced by Asao B. Inoue called labor-based grading contracts. This contract stipulates that grades in this class are based on labor and effort, not the quality of your writing.

Labor-based grading makes any grade possible for any student depending on how much work you are willing to put into class. This means that no student comes into the class with an unfair advantage or disadvantage based upon previous education or experience. Grading contracts all every student an equal chance to take big risks in their writing, and to fail, without worrying about the outcome of their formal letter grade. This will improve your opportunity to really get creative and learn.


Instead of being graded on your writing, you will receive feedback from me on each of your formal writing projects. This feedback is not calculated into your grade point average and is offered to help you learn and grow as a writer.

MY HOPF:

I hope this grading system will allow you the freedom and flexibility to take risks in your writing while also providing time for you to revise your writing drafts into more usable, sophisticated, and polished drafts—without the frustration and stress often associated with assigned letter grades to formal writing projects.

I will formulate final course grades based on labor, effort, and participation. To do well, you will need to write creatively, offer generous participation, and put forth your best effort each day.
